Keeping Everyone Safe - Some reminders:

- Please close all gates and doors behind you. This is to keep all of our children safe.
- Please do not park on the yellow zig zags outside Nursery. If the fire engine needs to attend an emergency to save a life and your car is in the way, they will move it by whatever means available!
- Please let us know, by phoning the Nursery if someone else will be collecting your child. Remember, we will not let your child go with someone we don't know or haven't been told is collecting your child. Passwords must be used.
- Please Do NOT park on the grass verge outside of the nursery school. This area is a public walking right of way. Thank you for looking after all our children and families in our community by not parking in this area.
- Could we please ask that mobile phones are not used outside the nursery gate so that family leaders can talk to you on the handover should they need to. Thank you.
- When taking your child home in a vehicle, please secure children safely in their appropriate, and legally required, car seat before you drive off.

Some reminders:

- At nursery, we encourage the children to eat healthy snacks such as milk, water, fruit and vegetables. We would like to do the same at lunch time, on our website under newsletters is a poster with suggestions of healthy lunch options to give you some extra ideas of the kind of things you can send in for children, which can include a small treat such as a biscuit bar.
- Please can we ask that children only bring a small named plastic bag with spare clothes and their packed lunch. Please ensure that all items of clothing are named.
- Please do not bring any toys from home into nursery, we do not want to lose them!!
- The snack collection trolleys are fully in operation now - please do drop your child's contribution of fruit into the trolley that will be positioned at the gate on their arrival. Thank you!

Please do let us know if your child is going to be absent from Nursery School - whether it is because of illness, family circumstances or holiday. Call **01827 794164** and leave an absence message or tell the reception staff.

Regular school attendance is important for the children to make relationships and learn. However, young children do become poorly, especially at this time of year, so please keep them at home if they are unwell. Thank you very much to everyone for co-operating in letting us know when your child can not attend. We are very grateful for the phone calls and messages.

Remember—with vomiting sickness and diarrhoea please give a clear 48 hours before sending your child back to nursery.

And remember you must not send children in if you have had to give them Calpol— give them time at home to get well.

BUTTERFLY NURSERY NEWS

It has been so lovely to see all the returning children come back after Christmas with so much excitement ready to learn again. We have welcomed some new children into Nursery. They are all getting to know the Nursery rules and routines well. They have had lots of fun exploring the environment and the new activities on offer. We can't wait to continue to watch them grow and learn as they begin their Nursery journey with us!

During the new term we have been spending lots of time outside!

We have been noticing how different the world around us looks in winter and how it is different to other seasons of the year. We have enjoyed finding ice and observing what has frozen inside it. We have been noticing what happens when we break the ice on the hard playground and listen to the noise and patterns it makes.

We have been learning all about Chinese New Year and the wonderful joy it brings to many people around the world. We have heard the story of Nian and acted out using musical instruments to scare Nian the beast away. We have been practicing ordering our numbers as we listened to the Great Animal Race, which tells us about how the Chinese Calendar was named. As a special treat we also did some Chinese food tasting and enjoyed prawn crackers, sweet chilli and hoisin sauce, spring rolls and noodles! It was delicious!

CURRICULUM PROJECT

This term, in both Butterfly and Caterpillar Nurseries we are starting a Project that will last until the Summer. The children are being asked a question – What is in the garden? Each family group will talk about and find out about their own ideas – we look forward to seeing the direction that the children take this in, and finding out about the things that interest them.

This week, for National Storytelling week, we are having a focus on our allotment, with the story of Jasper's Beanstalk, and Oliver's Vegetables to encourage the children to think about growing and what lives in and under the soil. We will also be focusing on the birds as it is the RSPB bird counting week, so things that come into and fly over the garden too.

If you have a garden at home or visit friends or relatives who have a garden, ask them the question "what's in the garden?" There are no right or wrong answers – they may talk about toys, stones, garden ornaments, anything that catches their interest!
