

Atherstone Nursery School – Learning Focus Share 2

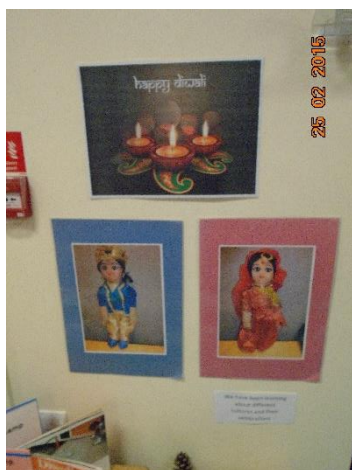
Every fortnight we will share with you some information into what the key learning focuses and experiences have been.

Wow! What a busy couple of weeks we have had in Butterfly Nursery.

We have been learning about Diwali and have read the story of Rama and Sita. We were lucky enough to try some Indian foods like samosa, vegetable pakora and sweet treats. We all did fantastic trying and some of us enjoyed it so much we had seconds!

For Bonfire night, we have busy making firework pictures using chalks and big arm movements on the playground. We have used oil chalks to draw our own pictures of fireworks onto black paper. We also learned about fire safety and how we can keep ourselves safe on fireworks night.



We have had lots of pumpkins in Nursery for Halloween. We have been exploring what is inside a pumpkin and hammering golf tees into the sides to help us strengthen the muscles in our arms ready for writing. We have talked what they look like and feel like and captured our ideas by doing observational drawings of the pumpkins. We even made some pumpkin soup- it was delicious!



Last week was Remembrance Day. We learned about what Remembrance Day is and why we remember. There have been lots of poppy activities in Nursery, including making Poppy art work, counting poppies, singing songs about poppies. On Remembrance Day we all gathered on the playground and made a big poppy using natural resources and held our 2-minute silence.



In Maple room, we have been using the choosing box to access different activities that interest us. We have enjoyed having lot of small pieces to allow us to fill, empty and pour different materials and objects. We have all been working hard at the work station to complete adult directed tasks. This has allowed us to develop a routine and be aware of expectations.
