## Message from the Head of Federation

Hello All

What a wonderful start to the Autumn Term we have had, it is just lovely to have the school full of children again. Welcome back to our returning families and a huge welcome to our new families that have joined our nursery family.

We have had our new children starting their induction with us, getting to know their new nursery environment and getting to know our staff team. Every child will settle at their own pace and we will support every family individually with settling plans. For many of our children they have lived their life through COVID pandemic times and spent more time at home so settling away from their familiar grown up's may be that little bit harder – but that is okay and we will support every child through that.

We will send you a newsletter every month with updated news/any requests and any updates. We will send you fortnightly a learning focused email that will share with you all the learning and experiences your child has been experiencing at Nursery. We have also attached with the newsletter information on how your child's keyperson will share your child's progress with you. These meetings are extremely important as your reflections and sharing's are key.

We are starting to notice a change in the weather this week, please do make sure your child has layers of clothes on, spare clothes and suitable shoes for exploring our outdoor environments. We have been recommended from public health to keep windows open to allow for ventilation as we know COVID is still circulating in our area and ventilation reduces the transmission.

If your child tests positive for COVID please call school and we will inform you of Warwickshire self-isolation guidelines. If your child is unwell, please do keep them off school until they are well.

If you have any questions, comments, reflections please do email or phone our admin team and they will direct you to the best person to speak to – our door is always open and working with you all in collaboration is extremely important to us.

### Keeping Everyone Safe - Some reminders:

- Please close all gates and doors behind you. This is to keep all of our children safe.
- Please do not park on the yellow zig zags outside Nursery. If the fire engine needs to attend an emergency to save a life and your car is in the way, they will move it by whatever means available!
- Please let us know, by phoning the Nursery if someone else will be collecting your child. Remember, we will not let your child go with someone we don't know or haven't been told is collecting your child. Passwords must be used.
- Please Do NOT park on the grass verge outside of the nursery school. This is area is a public walking right of way. Thank you for looking after all our children and families in our community by not parking in this area.
- Could we please ask that mobile phones are not used outside the nursery gate so that family leaders can talk to you on the handover should they need to. Thank you.

### Some reminders:

- At nursery, we encourage the children to eat healthy snacks such as milk, water, fruit and vegetables. We would like to do the same at lunch time, on our website under newsletters is a poster with suggestions of healthy lunch options to give you some extra ideas of the kind of things you can send in for children, which can include a small treat such as a biscuit bar.
- Please can we ask that children only bring a small named plastic bag with spare clothes and their packed lunch. Please ensure that all items of clothing are named.
- Please do not bring any toys from home into nursery, we do not want to loose them!!
- The snack collection trolleys are fully in operation now - please do drop your child's contribution of fruit into the trolley that will be positioned at the gate on their arrival. Thank you!
- If any families are needing to store prams in the pram store they can now do so.

Please do let us know if your child is going to be absent from Nursery School - whether it is because of illness, family circumstances or holiday. Call **01827 794164** and leave an absence message or tell the reception staff.

Regular school attendance is important for the children to make relationships and learn. However, young children do become poorly, especially at this time of year, so please keep them at home if they are unwell. Thank you very much to everyone for co-operating in letting us know when your child can not attend. We are very grateful for the phone calls and messages.

**Remember—with vomiting sickness and diarrhoea please give a clear 48 hours before sending your child back to nursery.**

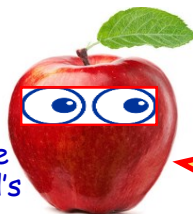
