Caterpillar Nursery Water Area

Caterpillar Nursery Home Corner Area

(a) Playdough to be located near the home-corner to support children who enjoy transporting their creations into the home-corner

















Caterpillar Nursery Malleable Area

Malleable resources – to provide the opportunity to strengthen children's hands and develop the muscles needed for fine motor. It provides a therapeutic experience for creativity and helps develop concentration skills.

Vocab – squash, mould, pinch, twist, squeeze, soft, gentle, hard, smooth, half, roll, press, cut, push, sculpt, turn, stretch,

Other -

- (a) to be enhanced with additional resources to provide further challenge or develop new skills.
- (b) To be located near the home corner to support children who like to transport their creations into the home-corner










Caterpillar Nursery Book Area

Book resources – to develop a love of reading and share books, explore the features of a book, know how to handle books with care and stimulate imagination and storytelling Vocab – book, cover, words, pictures, story, poem, rhyme, beginning, end, Other -

Caterpillar Nursery Sensory Area

Sensory resources – to provide an area that stimulates children's senses such as sight, sound, smell, taste or touch. It can also provide a calming and therapeutic area for our children and help them work through their emotions, anxieties and frustrations.

Caterpillar Nursery Group Time Area

Group time – Our family time spaces are for opportunities to sing, dance, listen to stories, explore our project, turn-take, and gather in a small group for focus activity time. We start by asking all the children to self-register, we then sing our hello song and share the group rules. Then we look at our visual timetable together to know the routine of the day and start our activity.













Caterpillar Nursery Sand Area

Caterpillar Nursery Music Area
